tSB Class of 2010 ... The Schedule — The Basics

- ❖ **Program orientation** is on Sunday January 10, 2010. Our mandatory (and fundatory) weekend retreat runs from Saturday, January 30th at 8am to Sunday, January 31st at 6pm (all meals provided).
- ❖ **White Center** meets on **Tuesdays** 6-8pm starting 1/12/10 and **South End** meets on **Wednesdays** from 6-8pm, starting 1/13/10.
- ❖ Sundays take you to the **mountains** (for snowboarding) or the **streets** (for volunteer service). On snowboarding days, plan on being up really early and being home around 6 pm (breakfast and lunch provided).
- ❖ The fee for **snowboarding** is only \$25 per trip. Scholarships are available, but remember that, for just \$25, we provide you with transportation, a lift ticket, Odwalla, equipment, instruction, lunch and **Snowboard Connection** gear.
- ❖ **tSB class of 2010** officially ends in June 2010, but the opportunities keep going and going and going.

Everything counts. We encourage you to have a friend, counselor, teacher, coach or parent/guardian help you fill out your application.
